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UNSAFE SCHOOLS FOR LGBTQ YOUTH: NOT DIFFICULT TO IMAGINE

Imagine you woke up this morning and desperately wanted to stay home because you felt unsafe or uncomfortable at work. **Thirty percent of LGBTQ students missed at least one day of school in the past month** because they felt unsafe or uncomfortable at their school.

Imagine as you went about your day, you were incessantly harassed. **Eighty-five percent** of LGBTQ kids were verbally harassed in the past year.

Imagine your boss called you a 'fag' or a 'dyke' at work and there were no consequences because your company did not have a policy that protects you from discrimination.

Fifty-six percent of LGBTQ students experience discriminatory school policies and practices because their school does not have a comprehensive antibullying policy that includes both sexual orientation and gender identity/expression.

Sadly, these situations are **not difficult to imagine**, because they happen every day.

CHAPTER TRACK RECORD OF SUPPORTING LGBTQ STUDENTS

Chapters like ours play **an important role** in bringing GLSEN's programs and visions to local communities. While some chapters have full-time or part-time staff, ours is **entirely volunteer-based**. Monthly regional GSTA meetings, school visits to address issues directly, professional development on ways to make schools **safe for all students**, coordinating our youth leadership training program – this is how GLSEN-Southern Maine addresses LGBTQ issues in schools and **make students feel safer**.

With limited resources, and thanks to the support of **generous friends like you,** we have made enormous progress in improving the lives of LGBTQ students in Southern Maine. Over the last year GLSEN-Southern Maine:

- Held nine (9) regional GSTA evening meetings with an average of 40 people in attendance each from an average of nine (9) schools;
- Planned three (3) statewide LGBTQ youth conferences with over 300 attendees: two for educators, social workers, and health care professionals, and **one for youth and by youth**;
- Trained 11 students from nine (9) high schools through our Youth Leadership Team
- Coordinated educational programs in over 75 Gay-Straight-Trans Alliances (GSTAs) throughout the state.
